Mr. Francis J. Lombardi and Mr. Michael Burton will discuss the role of engineers in response to the World Trade Center Disaster of September 11th. The presentations will address the initial emergency response, and the engineering and construction challenges related to Ground Zero.

Francis J. Lombardi began serving as chief Engineer for the Port Authority of New York and New Jersey in 1995. He is the director of in-house Engineering Department staff as well as a number of professional, technical, and advisory consultants to oversee implementation of the Capital and Maintenance Programs and ensure the continued safe and effective operation of the Port Authority facility. Mr. Lombardi is a member of the American Society of Civil Engineers and serves on the board of construction Institute. Consultors to the Department of Civil Engineering at Manhattan College, and he serves on the Board of Directors of the Salvadori Center. In 1970, Mr. Lombardi graduated from New York University, where he studied Civil Engineering. Mr. Lombardi also received a Master of Science degree in Structures from Columbia University and a Certificate of Advanced Graduate Study in Business Management from Pace University.

Michael Burton is the Executive Deputy Commissioner for the New York City Department of Design and Construction. He manages a staff of 1,300 design and construction professionals with a portfolio of 1,050 projects valued at more than \$4.1 billion. His most recent assignment is managing the construction and engineering operations for the World Trade Center recovery, stabilization and clean-up effort. Prior to joining the Department of Design and Construction in 1996 he worked as a contractor and construction manager in both heavy construction and building construction. He is a graduate of the Manhattan College and has a MBA and PE license.

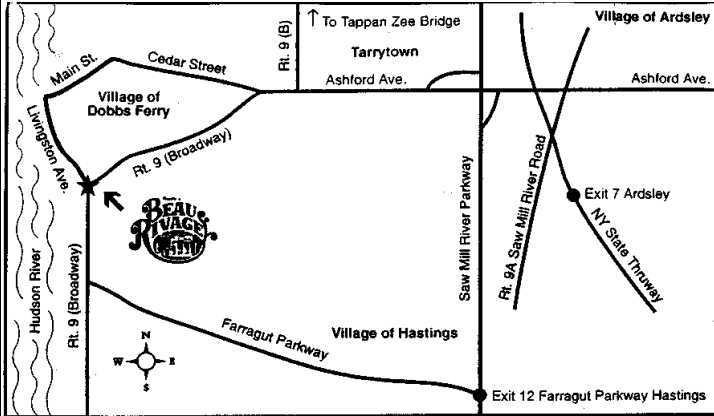

New Jersey: Palisade Parkway North to Tappan Zee Bridge, first exit after the toll, make left at end of exit ramp to Route 9 South. Continue through Irvington and into Dobbs Ferry. Rudy's is on the right corner of Rt. 9 and Livingstone Avenue. Or George Washington Bridge to Henry Hudson Parkway to Saw Mill River Parkway North, exit 12 continue straight for 5 lights, 5th light Rudy's is on the left.

Connecticut Cross Westchester Expressway (287 West) to 87 South (New York), to Saw Mill River Parkway South, to exit 17 (Dobbs Ferry/Ardsley), continue straight for 5 lights, Rudy's is on the right.

**Manhattan
Brooklyn** F. D. R. Drive North to New York State Thruway North exit 7 Ardsley. Make right at end of exit and left at first light, continue down Ashford Avenue for 7 lights, 7th light Rudy's is on the right.

**Queens
Long Island** Whitestone Bridge to Hutchinson River Parkway North. Exit 13 Cross County Parkway West to Saw Mill River Parkway North, exit 12 continue down Farragut Parkway for 5 lights, 5th light Rudy's is on the left.
